A Word from the Torah...

In this week's parsha God wants to teach us about being gracious and merciful. When we are motivated out of love for God, it is very natural to want to reach out to help others.

God gives us specific instructions about how to do just that.

CHECK OUT THE

By leaving some of our harvest unpicked and ungathered, we leave food to help the poor and needy among us. Now, since most of us are not farmers, can you think of other ways to fulfill this scripture?

What if you made a batch of brownies, and you gathered all the edge squares together on a plate and delivered them to the local food pantry?

When you harvest the ripe crops produced in your land, don't harvest all the way to the corners of your field, and don't gather the ears of grain left by the harvesters. Likewise, don't gather the grapes left on the vine or fallen on the ground after the harvest; leave them for the poor and the foreigner; I am Adonai your God." Leviticus 19:9 & 10

What if you used a bolt of fabric to sew a dress, then used the rest of the fabric to make a baby blanket for a sick child in the local hospital?

It is merciful to show kindness to others. God wants us to be generous because He gives us more than penough to give away!


Messiah Yeshua tells an interesting story about it in Mattityahu, chapter 25. Be sure to read it!
