A Word to live by ...

But remember, Yeshua told us in Luke 21:29-31 that we would know what signs to look for. WE WOULD <u>KNOW</u> THE <u>SEASON</u> OF HIS RETURN.

So, what season are we <u>looking</u> for?

Do you think when He comes back... He'll use the Fall Feasts to "Trumpet His arrival?" CHECK OUT THE

Well, since He's coming back to the <u>final</u> trumpet gall and the Fall Holy Days start with Rosh Hashana – the Feast of Trumpets... what do you think? Look at what the prophet Joel writes about Messiah's coming!

Wow! And what about Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) and Sukkot (Feast of Tabernacles)? When He comes back, will/ Yeshua fulfill those, too?

Take a few minutes and look up these two other prophetic scriptures that Zechariah wrote...

(Zech 12:10 and 14:16)

Ask your teacher for help figuring this stuff out. It's awesome!

A Word from the Torah...

All time belongs to God. One of the most important ways to honor God is to live according to His schedule, His <u>timetable</u>. In this week's parsha, Adonai tells Moshe that He has set aside special days and time for us to visit with Him.

CHECK OUT THE

God has appointed SEVEN special times to meet with Him. During these times, we are to do no "regular work." We are to spend this time resting and worshipping God.

The first and most obvious time to visit with God is our weekly <u>Shabbat</u>. We enjoy a meal together, pray, sing, Meet at <u>synagogue</u> and study scripture.

The other six appointed times are divided into two Holy Day Seasons.

Adonai said to Moshe, "Tell the people of Israel; 'the designated times of Adonai which you are to proclaim as holy convocations are my designated times."
