A Word from the Torah ...

This week's parsha teaches a lot about being responsible for the promises we make to God. Promises to God, especially when <u>spoken</u> out loud and in the temple, would bind the person to whatever he promised.

It was never okay to promise something to God and then NOT do it!


In this part of the Israelite's journeyto inherit the promised land, two of the tribes wanted to settle where they just landed - Reuben and Gad.

"When a man makes a vow to
Adonai or formally obligates
himself by swearing an oath,
he is not to break his word
but is to do everything
he said he would do.

Numbers 30:2 CJB

Moshe agreed to their request, as long as they kept fighting along with all their brothers across the Yarden until all the tribes had their land areas, too!

The Reubenites and Gadites kept their promise before God and kept fighting alongside their brothers until the promised land was secured for all.



Hmmm, now think about this...

Isn't it amazing that those two tribes would keep fighting for the other ten tribes even though they could have stopped right there? Wouldn't it have really discouraged everybody if they didn't keep their promise?

Do you keep promises that you make to God? Do you think carefully about what vows you make or do you just let "any of'e thing" come flying out of your mouth to get what you want?

A Word from Yeshua...

According to Yeshua, it's not just the "on purpose" promises we make that count... CHECK OUT THE

It seems, that God is also concerned about the things we say without thinking through, too.

In fact, there is this very serious stor about a couple in the Book of Acts, Chapter 5.

The couple in this story made a vow to give all their money from a piece of land they were selling as an offering among the bretheren for their needs.

But instead of fulfilling their vow to the Lord, they kept part of the money for themselves and God judged them very harshly! (You can read the story with your teacher

if you'd like.)

The story is very serious because breaking their vow to God, without repenting, cost them their lives!

And then a great fear of the Lord swept over the believers!

"...people will have to give an account for every careless word spoken. For by your word you will be acquitted and by your words you will condemned."

Mattiyahu 12:36b & 37
